

READ BEFORE USEIMPORTANT NOTICE ABOUT PRIMING YOUR SPRAYER

When first operating a new battery-powered backpack sprayer or after extended storage, the pump MAY need to be manually primed, once, prior to use. Please follow the procedure below:


AWARNING: RISK OF PERSONAL INJURY DUE TO CHEMICAL EXPOSURE. Use the appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) as recommended by the chemical manufacturer and/or refer to the chemical Safety Data Sheet (SDS) of the chemical being used. This includes at least goggles, gloves, and protective clothing.

AWARNING: RISK OF PERSONAL INJURY AND/OR PROPERTY DAMAGE DUE TO CHEMICAL EXPOSURE. Always ensure that all chemical has been removed from the sprayer and the sprayer has been cleaned prior to performing any maintenance.

AWARNING: RISK OF PERSONAL INJURY. Always release pressure from the sprayer prior to performing any maintenance. Disassembly of a sprayer that is still pressurized may result in the high speed ejection of components.

HOW TO CHECK IF MANUAL PRIMING IS NEEDED

- 1. Fill the sprayer with approximately one (1) gallon of water (without chemical).
- 2. Install the battery and turn sprayer "ON".
- 3. Aim the shut-off in a safe direction and squeeze the trigger lever.
- 4. **If water sprays,** manually priming is not required. Turn sprayer **"OFF"** and empty water from the tank. Please proceed to operating your sprayer. Review and understand the entire Instruction Manual prior to use with chemical.
- 5. If the sprayer pump is audibly running but no water is spraying, follow the procedure outlined below for **Manually Priming the Sprayer Pump**.

- 3. Turn the power switch to the "ON" position. If your sprayer has multiple spray settings (variable flow), set the dial to the highest setting.
- 4. Squeeze the trigger lever and lock in place to keep the valve open. This allows fluid to flow, once the pump is primed.
- 5. Firmly press and hold the end of a garden hose (without nozzle) directly to the pump inlet (where red filter was located), leaving little to no gap for water to escape out of the sides of the opening.
- 6. Spray directly into the pump inlet, while the power is on and the pump is running. The backpack should start spraying within 10 20 seconds.
- 7. Once the backpack begins spraying, stop spraying with the hose.
- 8. Unlock and release the trigger lever, prior to turning the power "OFF".
- 9. Empty the tank (if needed), and reinstall the red filter.
- 10. The backpack sprayer is ready for use. Review and understand the entire Instruction Manual prior to use with chemical.
